## HISTORY & OVERVIEW

Buda, originally named De Pre, saw a burst of growth after the International and Greater Northern Railroad expanded from Austin to San Antonio. When a rail stop was placed in Buda, more and more business came to the area. Located along Interstate Highway 35, just 20 minutes from Austin, Buda is in Hays County and is considered one of the fastest growing cities in the region.



## EDUCATION

Hays ISD has 25 campuses with 3 comprehensive high schools, 6 middle schools and 14 elementary schools. Both high schools have Project Lead the Way designation and award-winning music, theater and athletic programs.



## MAJOR BUSINESS INDUSTRIES

Buda has seen extensive expansion and overall growth in recent years. The city has a diverse range of business opportunities with health care and social assistance, retail trade, education, construction and professional, and technical and scientific businesses representing the major industries. Some of the largest employers include Baylor Scott & White, Capital City Steel, Centex Materials and Jardine Foods.



## ARTS & CULTURE

Buda is home to several historic attractions, including the historic Downtown District, 1898 Building, Buda Mill & Grain Co. and the historic McElroy-Severn Stagecoach House and Visitor Center. Visitors and residents make it a priority to visit the 185,000 square foot Cabela's with showrooms, aquariums, archery range and restaurant.



## DINING

Buda has several restaurants with a variety of food selections. With Austin being just 20 minutes away, residents have the additional benefit of going to Austin to enjoy the music scene and even more dining options. Some of the local favorites in Buda include Brooklyn's Down South, Beaux Seafood, Cypress Grill, Hat Creek Burgers and Louie's Craft BBQ.



## WINERIES, BREWERIES AND PUBS

Several wineries and breweries are conveniently located near Buda. Driftwood, Wimberly and other Texas Hill Country favorites are a short distance away. For residents looking to enjoy award winning wine in Buda, they can stop by Water 2 Wine in the Buda Mill and Grain.



## PARKS AND OUTDOORS

Named the Outdoor Capital of Texas, Buda offers wide open green spaces for all to enjoy. The town has numerous parklands and recreational areas. Residents can hike, bike and explore several different parklands and recreational areas. Some of the most notable include: Stagecoach Park, Bradfield Village Park, Buda City Park and Jackson Tyler Norris Memorial Skate Park.



## FESTIVALS

Buda hosts a variety of festivals throughout the year. Residents and visitors all enjoy exploring shops and listening to music at First Saturday. They also enjoy the downtown Buda Farmer's Market and Buda Lions County Fair and Weiner Dog Races. The community hosts an annual Easter Egg Hunt, a Red, White n' Buda Independence Day Celebration, Fajita Fiesta and Cocoa Jingle.
